## Carols on the Green – Christmas Eve

Don't forget to take a break from peeling spuds or wrapping last-minute gifts to come to The Green on Christmas Eve at about 6pm – rain or shine – for free sausages, mulled wine, and singing! Everyone is invited to come along – and bring your singing voices and instruments if you have them to add to the volume – to join in this festive occasion which marks the start of Christmas in Culworth for many.



## Remembrance Sunday – 10<sup>th</sup> November

The day was damp and slightly chilly, but it was pleasing to have a good congregation of 45 with 5 children in church. There were two families where the father is currently a serving officer and five others who have served in the armed services.

With the congregation in good voice, five hymns were sung, including the National Anthem. Andrew Wilby, Chair of Culworth Parish Council, read a lesson from Revelations and James Stewart one from St Johns Gospel about loving one another. Gerald Cadogan gave a very fitting address.

At the War Memorial, beautifully planted around with red and white Chrysanthemums, the congregation swelled to about 70 people. During the short Act of Remembrance led by Gerald Cadogan, Luke Annaly read out the names of the fallen in both First and Second World Wars which was followed by the Exhortation and the two minute silence. No traffic passed during the ceremony. Wreaths were laid by David Mold on behalf of the Royal British Legion, June Oxley for the Church and Andrew Wilby for the Parish Council.

Thank you all for supporting this Act of Remembrance of not just past wars but also current areas of conflict in the World.

### Remembrance Sunday address given by Gerald Cadogan



“106 years ago tomorrow morning, at 11 o’clock, the armistice came into effect and the fighting of the First World War stopped. Thereafter the 11th of November was known for a long time as Armistice Day when everything, but everything, stopped for 2 minutes at 11 – as I remember, and others here must too, from childhood. Even if, officially, it had become Remembrance Day in 1945, so as to honour also those in the armed forces who died in the Second World War. And that is what we are doing now, remembering with honour the people of Culworth whose names are on the memorial plaque by the pulpit – which will be read out at the War Memorial.

And with them we’ll think of members of our own families and our friends’ families who died. A cousin of mine lost her husband and her brother in a week in 1941: 27 years old, her hair turned white overnight, and stayed so till she died at 90.

We remember too those who were not in the armed forces who died, women and children, and civilian males, caught in the Blitz or similar violence anywhere in the world. They are to be honoured and cherished. Ukraine, Gaza, Beirut, Sudan and many other places make it all too clear, all too painful, that death from war is not confined to people in uniform. Every day we see the terrible fate of thousands of civilians caught up in local wars, with nowhere to escape to, but determined to stand by their families and friends and their property, whatever it is, that has such an important part in their human identity.

Finally we should remember the many people on the other side in this country’s wars, who were not ideological fanatics, but were just being patriotic for their country and their cause, and suffered as much as those on this side, if not more. Think of the horror of being in the battle at Stalingrad.

All these, and their surviving families, need both our prayers and our recognition of what they achieved, and our gratitude for that. For this country, as for continental Europe, the time since 1945 – now 79 years – is the longest period of peace this part of the world has ever known. How right it is to say: We will remember them. And then keep silence.

And we must never cease praying for, and doing all we can to promote, peace and non-violence, as we shall be doing in the next part of this service. May God bless those who gave their lives, or were wounded. And may God bless all who work for a better and more loving world. Amen.”

## **A LETTER FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN**

Season's Greetings from the Parish Council

Members of the Council join with me in wishing you all a Happy Christmas and a prosperous New Year.

"Carols on The Green" will take place again this year at 6pm on Christmas Eve. Please join in with your neighbours, family and friends for this traditional event which happens every year come icy wind, snow, storm or tempest. Mulled wine and hot dogs will again be distributed free to all as we mark, as a community, the start of Christmas. In January the Council has to agree the Budget for 2025/6. It will be much the same as the current year covering, amongst other things, the costs of maintaining the village environment, the street lighting and now the maintenance costs of the children's play area.

For a number of years now the Council has been building a reserve towards the future cost of renewing the village hall facility and this will continue. It is a duty of the Parish Council within the Local Government Act, amongst its many other duties, to ensure the provision of a community meeting facility. Since 1938 this responsibility has been discharged by the Village Hall Trust. However, a few years ago it was recognised that the physical state of the old wooden structure required replacement as it was getting beyond economic repair and also was limiting its use to the community since it was no longer compliant with access and other modern standards. It remains a responsibility of the Council to seek a solution to the problem. As a result, the Parish Council, the Village Hall Trust and the Cricket Club [as tenant of the sports field] jointly formed the "Culworth Hill Field Trust" as an organisation to harness the support of local volunteers with relevant expertise to deliver what is a major complex project on behalf of the three partners and community.

Much has been achieved in acquiring the land, obtaining Planning Permission by discharging the Planning requirements such as the car park, and securing a large grant from Sport England to improve the field facilities. The plans for the new Village Hall were then undermined by the economic situation, Covid and the Russian energy crisis which caused all such relevant funding streams to be diverted elsewhere. CHFT is currently initiating a study of the alternative options open to the community - which will be a task for 2025.

So, there is much to do in the new year including the Local Government elections in May. We have to elect 7 Parish Councillors for the next 5 years to deliver a serious amount of legal responsibility on your behalf - for no thanks or reward by the way! I would encourage anybody who feels able to make a contribution of service to their local community to consider standing for election. To that end please get in touch with the Clerk, or attend a meeting or find out what is involved from a Councillor and then stand!

That is for 2025. For the rest of this year, please have a great Christmas and New Year!

## **Lions Clubs Message in a Bottle Scheme**

More than 6 million Message in a Bottle kits have been distributed by Lions Clubs International (MD105) British Isles to people with conditions such as diabetes, allergies, disabilities and life-threatening illnesses.

Lions Clubs Message in a Bottle is a simple but effective way for people to keep their basic personal and medical details where they can be found in an emergency on a standard form and in a common location – the fridge.

Message in a Bottle helps emergency services personnel to save valuable time in identifying an individual very quickly and knowing if they have any allergies or take special medication. Paramedics, police, fire-fighters and social services support this Lions life-saving initiative and know to look in the fridge when they see the Message in a Bottle stickers (usually stuck on the fridge). The initiative provides peace of mind that prompt and appropriate medical assistance can be provided, and next of kin / emergency contacts can be notified.
