Bell Rope Guide for St Mary's Church

For some time now the five bells at Culworth Church have had a somewhat undeserved reputation for being difficult to handle. The reason for this is that they have a long draught. In simple terminology this means that it is a long distance from the floor in the tower where the bell ringers stand to the point where the ropes disappear through the holes in the ceiling above their heads. With such an unrestrained length of rope it is easier to miss catching the sally - the woolly part of the bellrope - as it descends.

The remedy for the problem is to fit bell rope guides at a point about 15 feet (4.575m) above the floor. This creates a virtual ceiling through which the ropes can pass and reduces the length of unrestrained rope thus making them easier to control.

A voluntary team drawn from the bellringing fraternity has drilled the holes in the wall for the main cross member of the frame with two subframes attached to it. Making sure that the 'jugs' on the subframes, through which the ropes pass are in exactly the correct position has then taken quite a deal of care.

It is to be hoped that the improved handling of the bells will increase the numbers of ringers wishing to ring "the bells of St Mary's". In this area there is a shortage of bellringers. Anybody wishing to take up the pastime would be most welcome and could be put in contact with a suitable person to teach them. It really is never too late to learn a new skill!

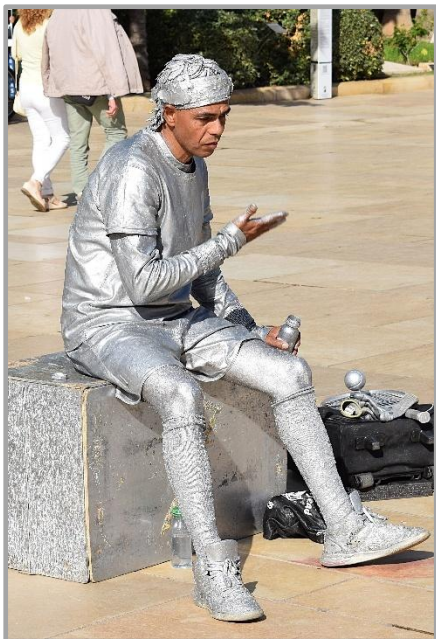

Church Electoral Roll - In every parish there must be a church electoral roll. A new roll is prepared every 6 years and ours must be revised in 2025 in time for the Annual Meeting (4th May). A form is available on the table in the church if you would like to be on that roll.

Annual Parochial Church Meeting - In every parish the annual parochial church meeting (APCM) must be held before 31st May. At this meeting the P.C.C. and the church wardens are elected by those on the church's electoral roll. This year our APCM will be after Evensong on **Sunday 4th May at about 6.40**. It is the PCC's responsibility among other things to maintain the church buildings and 'other assets'. We do need some more people on the PCC who can help steer us through uncertain times. Or alternatively, a kit can be ordered using a form on the public website - see: <https://lionsmessageinabottle.co.uk/> More than 6 million Message in a Bottle kits have been distributed by Lions Clubs International (MD105) British Isles to people with conditions such as diabetes, allergies, disabilities and life-threatening illnesses.

Lions Clubs Message in a Bottle is a simple but effective way for people to keep their basic personal and medical details where they can be found in an emergency on a standard form and in a common location – the fridge. Message in a Bottle helps emergency services personnel to save valuable time in identifying an individual very quickly and knowing if they have any allergies or take special medication.
